## SSIS-M Wins Best Reading School in the Country Award



**Stonyhurst Southville International School - Malarayat (SSIS-M)** was awarded as the **Best Reading School** in the **Philippines at the 2024 Scholastic Readers Cup** held last October 22, 2024 at the Edsa Shangri-La, Manila. Competing against 200 other schools, SSIS-M students ranked first in the number of books read and increase in reading proficiency to bring home the prestigious title.
