



















Our Foreign Students Circle Acquaintance Party was a blast! Games, food, and friendships were made. It was wonderful to see our international students connect and have a great time.







SOCIALEMOIONAL LEARNING(SEL) CORNER

Strength-Based Parenting. RECOGNIZING AND NURTURING YOUR CHILD'S UNIQUE STRENGTHS

For kids, the world is their playground. Whether it's playing games with friends or figuring out how to communicate and solve problems, your child uses their strengths to navigate everyday challenges. While they may not be curing cancer or solving the world's greatest mysteries—at least not just yet—they're building the foundational skills that will help them get there.

Cognitive Strength: Children with cognitive strengths are naturally curious and approach situations with empathy and thoughtfulness. They show resilience in the face of new challenges and are not easily deterred by failure.

Strategy: To foster this strength, be a role model by sharing your own thought processes and learning experiences. Encourage goal-setting together and demonstrate how to help others or overcome challenges with perseverance.

Social Strength: If your child demonstrates the ability to comfort peers, respect personal space, and listen attentively, they are honing strong social skills.

Strategy: Foster open, honest communication at home and practice active listening. Encourage them to build relationships with others, like befriending a new student or starting a group activity, to develop these social skills further.

Language Strength: A child with strong language skills can communicate ideas clearly, whether through storytelling, problem-solving, or using rich vocabulary and expressive non-verbal cues.

Strategy: Provide opportunities for creative language use, like enrolling them in acting or debate classes. Encourage imaginative storytelling and create spaces for open discussions at home where their ideas are welcomed and valued.

Literacy Strength: Literacy strengths show up through a child's love for reading and writing, where they use these tools to express their creativity and emotions.

Strategy: Take your child to the library to explore a variety of reading materials and help them discover different genres. Encourage them to write stories, journals, or even challenge them with creative writing prompts to boost their confidence.

Math and Logic Strength: Children with strong math and logic skills excel at tasks like organizing, sorting, solving puzzles, or manipulating objects in space.

Strategy: Use hands-on, interactive activities like strategy games (chess, checkers) or estimation games (guessing the number of items in a jar). Cooking is another great opportunity to practice math, such as measuring ingredients or adjusting recipe quantities.

Creative Strength: Whether through art, music, or spontaneous performances, creative children express themselves through various mediums and lave to experiment with new forms of expression.

Strategy: Offer platforms for creativity, such as different types of art supplies or musical instruments. Support their artistic passions and help them explore new avenues for expression. Communicate with your child about their creative interests and provide opportunities to explore new forms of creativity, from painting to acting or music.

By recognizing and nurturing these strengths, you can help your child build confidence in their abilities and provide them with the tools to continue growing in a supportive and engaging environment.
