- Triaging patients: Prioritizing treatment based on the severity of injuries.1
- Basic first aid: Administering immediate care, such as wound dressing and CPR.²
- **Emergency response procedures:** Coordinating efforts and evacuating victims safely.
- **Psychological first aid:** Providing emotional support to victims and responders.

By actively participating in this training, SISC students demonstrated their dedication to community service and their willingness to contribute to disaster relief efforts. This experience not only enhanced their academic knowledge but also cultivated a sense of empathy, responsibility, and resilience.
